




#### 2. What is your race/ethnicity? (check all that apply)








6. If divorced or separated, what percentage of the time does your child live with you?







#### 9. What is your child's race/ethnicity? (check all that apply)















17. Has your child used screen media more often during this summer than during the most recent school year (2020-2021)? Please do not consider school-related screen media use such as remote schooling.





18. Has your child used screen media more often this summer than last summer (2020)?









24. Does online communication provide your child with social and emotional support from peers?








#### 32. How healthy do you think your child's use of screen media is?


### 33. Do you think that your child is "addicted" to digital media?





35. Has your child attended camp(s) this summer?


















46. On a scale of 1 to 5 (1 being not at all anxious, 5 being very anxious), how anxious is your child about starting school this year?


47. Do you feel your child is more anxious about starting school this year than on a typical year?


48. On a scale of 1 to 5 (1 being not at all anxious, 5 being very anxious), how anxious are you about your child starting school this year?


49. On a scale of 1 to 5 (1 being not at all excited, 5 being very excited), how excited is your child about starting school this year?
